

# Power Outage Information and Updates

We have been talking with families, staff, and other community members regarding our new procedures when our community experiences a power outage. There were a number of questions that have been asked frequently. So, we thought we would try to give you as many details as we have about our new processes:

Decisions that we make are based on what is best for our students academic success as well as their safety and well-being at school. We follow specific protocol when we make decisions regarding school closure and we rely on many important guiding forces:

- State requirements
- Board Policy
- Administrative decision making
- Schools in our region (our situation may be different than those around us, based on available resources. For example we have access to water where some schools do not)
- Temperature requirements in order to open school


When we make the decision to open with a late start schedule, we do so to help keep our students engaged in learning. Sometimes even in the midst of a challenging situation, it is important to reconnect with schoolmates and stay focused on the learning journey. Our students had fun and learned a lot They were engaged in learning throughout the shortened schedule. It was so much fun to watch their resilience and focus on learning.

When school is in session during a power outage, we do have our full safety plan in place. We have the following:

- We have fewer phone lines, therefore we want to use them for all outgoing calls. If you would like us to contact you, you may use Remind or Dojo to let us know.
- Running water for restrooms, drinking fountains, and all water-use.
- Battery operated LED lanterns to eluminate classrooms.
- As long as weather cooperates and the temperature is not too low the night before, our classrooms are comfortable for learning.

We hope this information is helpful and reassuring.
